What's Love Got to Do with It?

Well we have moved into February the month of love, when we see red hearts all over the place. When we think about our Valentine and what we might do to help them know how special they are to us. (At least the romantic types do that, please don't ask Claudia how romantic I am.)

Tina Turner made a mint out of a song titled "What's Love Got to Do with It" and the chorus is this:

Oh what's love got to do, got to do with it

What's love but a second hand emotion

What's love got to do, got to do with it

Who needs a heart

When a heart can be broken

Well let's think about love for a moment: Jesus said, "This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this that one lay down their life for their friend." John 15:12-13 and then a few verses later Jesus rephrases the verse 12 when He said, "This I command you, that you love one another." John 15:17

Of course we have all heard many times at weddings 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 "Love is patient, love is kind and it not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own; is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered. Does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

We could say love has everything to do with living life for God. Isn't it amazing that in Galatians 5:22-23 the fruit of the Spirit begins this way: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace... If love were not important why list that first?

Finally I lift up 1 John 4:15-21 "Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in them, and they in God. We have come to know and have believed the love which God has for us. God is love, and the one who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in them. By this, love is perfected with us, so that we may have confidence in the day of judgment; because as He is, so also are we in this world. There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves punishment, and the one who fears is not perfected in love. We love because He first loved us. If someone says, 'I love God,' and hates their brother or sister, they are a liar; for the one who does not love their brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. And this commandment we have from God that the one who loves God should love their brother and sister also."

As people of God, loving one another is to be our secondary goal, immediately following our primary goal of loving God. Let us join together, arm in arm walking the path of Christ; loving one another.

So Tina, what's love got to do with it? Everything! Loving is the call of the Christian; loving God and loving one another.
